Some Notes on Sabbatical

For the first time in the History of HOILP (as well as both congregations of the parish), the pastor is being offered a sabbatical leave. So that the congregation might better understand the reasoning behind this, Greta Bates, a member from Immanuel who serves on the Parish Team and the newly formed Sabbatical team, has composed a three-part article that will be published in this and the next two Parish Voices. Pastor Jeff will include a short note of comment for each of the articles.

Rostered Minister Sabbatical by Greta Bates

From an article from the May 16, 2013 issue of Living Lutheran, *A Passport to Good Health*: "The idea of a sabbatical has biblical origins. The very root of the word is the same as that of 'Sabbath'. Throughout the Old Testament, God instructs people to work six days and rest on the seventh. In Leviticus, God instructs people to allow the land to rest every seventh year – meaning no farming, no planting, no harvesting." Along the same lines, a clergy sabbatical of 3 to 6 months is suggested by the compensation guidelines of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) and the Northern Illinois Synod (NIS) to sustain clergy health and promote renewal through a break in routine. The sabbatical is defined as a period in which the pastor has no contact with the congregation, and the congregation operates independently of the pastor for the duration of the defined period.

Family Aspects

ELCA and NIS-ELCA guidelines outline that clergy sabbatical include time for personal reflection, family renewal, and congregation self-examination. Sabbatical time can be used to re-connect with family, to redefine family relationships, and re-define vocation within the family. During the sabbatical, the congregation has the opportunity to keep the pastor and family in prayer.

This is a trip we've been trying to plan for quite a few years.

In June, I'll be heading east where Kim and I will spend time in the mountains of New Hampshire and then she'll show me around the historic city of Boston – her new hometown. (Though she says she's a Red Sox fan now, so that might put a strain on our relationship. Schlesingers are Cubs fans! ©) In early July I'll be heading to southern Minnesota to see Alex on stage and to stand in some streams with them in pursuit of brook trout.

And then at the end of July and into August, Theresa and I will be heading west to check off some destinations that have been on our bucket list since before the movie that made bucket lists a thing even came out. We'll be heading to Glacier National Park in Montana and to Holden Village in Washington. Those of you not familiar with Holden Village, it is a remote Lutheran Retreat Center in the Cascade Mountains that was originally a mining village.

You all will get to see Theresa occasionally over the summer, though she will be gone many weekends as she will joining me when I'm within driving distance. Feel free to ask her where in the world her husband is and which kid he is visiting.

Immanuel Council Highlights March 23, 2023

- As of March 21, \$55,605.00 has been received for the Raise the Roof campaign.
- The ending balance in the General Treasury on February 28 was \$10,453.51.
- Thank you notes were received from Lincoln School for the donation to their Backpack Blessings program and from Another Child Foundation for the money they received from Immanuel.
- The contract for the roof project has been signed.

Joint Council Highlights March 23, 2023

- Attendance is up a tick from this point last year and is more consistent.
- Pastor Joy Alsop of Faith, Rochelle, has agreed to be the on-call pastor for emergency hospital calls, funerals, etc., during Pastor Jeff's sabbatical. She will also be leading worship at the joint church service at Immanuel on May 28.
- Lay members are being recruited to be worship leaders, visit shut-ins and create the power points during the sabbatical.
- The Video Task Force recommends we begin using the Sunday morning worship services as the basis for our online video worship. A team of 4-5 people will be needed to run the cameras and post the video.
- The joint council approved moving forward with the planning to start recording the Sunday morning worship service as well as a budget of \$7,000.00 for purchasing a couple of cameras and a dedicated laptop.

- Moving forward, coffee and treats will be provided before Sunday worship, if people are willing to do so on a regular basis.
- The May/June benevolence will go to Lutherdale.
