## A Change in In-Person Worship Schedule for August

Beginning August 2, 2020, there will be only one regularly scheduled worship service each Sunday at 9:30 a.m. Both councils agreed on this as the attendance thus far has not justified the time, resources, and logistical complications to continue with two services. The procedures for calling in, entering and exiting the building, and seating will remain in place.

"In normal times, these low attendance numbers would bother me greatly," Pastor Jeff said when asked about the change. "But they don't bother me at all now. Part of that is because I know many people are taking advantage of our on-line worship. But part of it is because of our very unique situation. If people don't feel safe amongst others, or if they have health concerns which dictate caution, then by all means, they should take advantage of the worship video. But at the same time, if people are craving being in the presence of those in their community of faith, and they feel they can maintain appropriate and safe social distance, then we are happy to provide an in-person worship opportunity that is as safe as we are able to make it."

Pastor Jeff did go on to say that in the event a specific week fills up during the week, they will offer a second worship opportunity on Sunday evening for those who would otherwise be turned away. "That would be a fine problem to deal with," he said. "If it happens more than once, it will tell us that we need to reevaluate our worship time again."

## Communion is Coming Back!

Heart of Illinois Parish has not celebrated Holy Communion since Ash Wednesday! Having "put it away" for Lent and then the resulting pandemic has meant that it has been over six months since we celebrated the sacrament. That may be the longest either congregation of HOILP has ever gone without communion being available. But on August 9<sup>th</sup>, the fast will come to an end.

Pastor Jeff has found means by which communion can be offered safely, be part of a community gathering, and be available to all parishioners. "As the one called to see that the sacraments are administered in the right and proper ways, I did not feel comfortable having communion," PJ said.

The safety aspect is met by an item called a "fellowship cup." These little cups have both a communion wafer and a single serving of grape juice.

## Jeff's Jottings: Being Flexible Even Though I Can't Touch My Toes

Can you touch your toes? I don't mean can you bend your leg up so that you can put your shoe on. I mean, can you bend over from a standing position and touch your toes without bending your knees? I can't. And I haven't been able to for a very, very long time.

The rest of my family enjoys doing yoga. It is not unusual to find four mats crammed into our living room topped by four Schlesingers who are following the stretching instructions emanating out of the TV from a guy named Steve Ross. They've invited me to join them time and again. I did once. Once. I did not enjoy it. Perhaps it's because I'm not very flexible.

Flexibility has never really been my strong suit. At least from a physical standpoint. However, I hope that is different when it comes to my professional and social life.

I have to say, this pandemic has tested my patience at times. Not only has there been the pressure of having to suspend worship in our sanctuaries, but there has been the hectic pace of learning a whole new medium to provide shelter in place worship experiences. And when those things don't go as planned, my patience at times has been tested and has even run out.

I remember in March staying up just about all night trying to deal with upload issues. We thought we had them solved but then at Easter, of all times, they reared their ugly heads. On the Saturday before Easter I was sitting in McDonald's parking lot usurping their Wi-Fi to make sure our Easter service would be available on Easter Sunday morning. To this day, I maintain a fair bit of tension until I see that message on my computer screen on Saturday that says, "upload successful."

Or there was that one week when I went nuclear on a Friday night because I could not locate the video that I had been working on all week. I was just putting the finishing touches on it and suddenly, it was not on my screen. I searched every folder on my computer, but could not find it. The tension boiled over and I started yelling at my computer, at my desk and at the air. My wife will tell you that words came out of my mouth that you not only don't want to hear from your pastor, but that you don't want to hear out of anyone's mouth. I went to bed really late that night very, very frustrated and resolved to the fact that on Saturday I was going to have to start from scratch. At 7:00 a.m. the next morning, I sat down to begin the video anew when I clicked on a file whose name I did not recognize. Poof – there it was. All that time screaming and yelling, and my video was there all along. Just under a different name.

So perhaps I'm not all that flexible professionally. But, this last month may show that I'm learning. As we've returned to in-person worship, there have been some new challenges, especially as we use clips from our videos as part of our in-person worship. I thought I had them all figured out, but each time I took the files over to the computer at First Lutheran, there were some major snags in the process. But I'm happy to report, I dealt with them without having a temper tantrum and I'm pretty sure without my blood pressure even rising. I think I've learned to expect the fact that things will not go as planned and to be ready and willing to move on to plan B or C or D.

I cannot emphasize enough how important it is for all of us to be flexible during these times. None of us have ever experienced a pandemic before so we are all going through this for the first time. Some things will go right and some won't. We need to be flexible and ready to change paths as needed.

Our in-person worship change is an ideal example. We thought we'd need two services to accommodate our congregation. We didn't. So we're being flexible. For now, we're moving to one service a week. But we're prepared to be flexible enough to add another service some week if we need to. We're also prepared to suspend worship should this virus spike and things change again. We simply need to allow our worship times and our ministry practices to be fluid and flexible so that the gospel can continue to be proclaimed.

We need to be flexible. Maybe I will do yoga with my family again. Actually, I probably won't. But I will be flexible as your pastor. And I will be flexible for the sake of the gospel. For grace still happens even in the midst of a pandemic.

They are packaged in a way that maintains sanitary conditions as well as provides flexibility in communion distribution.

On August 9<sup>th</sup>, those attending worship will pick up a fellowship cup as they enter. Then at the appropriate time in the worship at the direction of Pastor Jeff, worshippers will receive the bread and wine at their pew.

"It's important not to exclude people from the sacrament," PJ said. "So we will deliver communion to anyone who wishes following that service. In this way, it will truly be an extension of the service."

Those who wish to receive communion on August 9<sup>th</sup> but will not be attending in-person worship simply have to call the Immanuel office during the week and let Debbie know you'd like to receive communion. A home communion bag will be prepared for you and placed on the altar during in-person worship. Then following worship, PJ or another volunteer will deliver the home communion bag to your door. It will literally come from the community gathering directly to you.

For August and September, mainly due to logistics, we will have communion only once each month (2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday). We will reevaluate the frequency after that and consider whether we are able to move to every Sunday communion.

## IMMANUEL NEWS

---

*At its July meeting, Immanuel's Council decided that as long as we are in phase 4 of the Restore Illinois plan, it would be alright for organizations of the church to meet, but using the following guidelines:*

### **Immanuel Lutheran Small Group Gatherings in time of Pandemic**

- Groups limited to 10 in size
- Only organizations of the parish and or partner organizations (such as NICE board, etc.) during the time of pandemic; no social events such as wedding receptions/rehearsal dinners, showers, family gatherings; no outside groups
- Masks and appropriate social distancing required while in the building
- Must let Pastor and/or Debbie know that meeting is taking place
- During regular office hours, must meet in basement and enter via the south doors
- After meeting, must turn in a report that lists attendance (for accountability in case a covid 19 case arises) and states every portion of the building utilized (for cleaning/sanitizing purposes)

Not discussed was the issue of having food at these gatherings. Generally, if serving food, it should be prepackaged food.
