## Christmas Season at HOILP

The Christmas season was rather odd last year as Christmas Day fell on a Sunday. It created some havoc around our normal Christmas schedule.

Well this year, it is even more chaotic as Christmas Eve falls on a Sunday in 2023. That means that December 24<sup>th</sup> is both the 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Advent and Christmas Eve. So the Parish Team struggled with what to do. Do we celebrate both Advent 4 and Christmas Eve? Do we do one and not the other? Do we have four services? Three services? Two services?

Consulting with the worship team, the decision was to celebrate both Advent 4 and Christmas Eve. But rather than hold four services on one day, the Advent 4 Sunday morning service will be online only, and we will gather together in person at our normal times in the evening to celebrate Christmas Eve.

The remainder of the Christmas fell into place with our normal traditions at HOILP: Christmas Day at Immanuel and a joint service on the 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday of Christmas at First.

### **Jeff's Jottings**

This summer while I was on sabbatical, I had the privilege of worshiping at numerous different congregations. It was a joy to have an opportunity to worship from the pews rather than up front. And it reinforced for me the honor of being able to lead worship on a weekly basis. When I returned in August, the excitement I had being back up in front reminded me of my early days of ordination.

As I worshipped this summer, I also had the chance to observe how other congregations do things. I noticed a common denominator in the congregations whose worship seemed the most vibrant – lay participation. The congregations that appeared to me to be most alive had lay members reading, serving communion, assisting with the liturgy, singing, doing temple talks, ushering, greeting, and various other activities during worship.

There is a theological consistency with this. The liturgy, after all, is supposed to be by the people, not by the clergy. The origin of the of the word liturgy is from the Greek word *liturgaia* (λιτυργηα) which means "work of the people." This is why I've used our lectors to offer the prayers of intercession, utilized our acolytes and others to do the dismissal, and used various other means to incorporate small worship leader roles by you all.

Did you know that during the pandemic, our worship videos were complimented by clergy and lay people alike. And I'm not talking about our lay people and our clergy (which would be me, of course). I'm talking about nonmembers who watched them. Though I like to think it was because of the production quality, which I think was decent in the beginning and got better and better as time went, that is not the reason for the compliments. The accolades came on account of you all. Our worship videos were set apart from other congregations' videos because we had so much congregational participation in them. In other words, they were the "work of the people."

The previous four paragraphs were a long-winded way to get to the point of this column. As your pastor, I am encouraging each and every one of you to find a way to participate in leading worship over the next year. There is no shortage of opportunities. In fact, here are worship leadership opportunities for each congregation:

*Immanuel* – usher, ring the bell, lector (read the lessons), serve on altar guild, learn and volunteer to man the sound system, learn and volunteer to man the projector, provide fellowship treats, play in the chime choir, sing or play an instrument for special music, volunteer to chant liturgy, put together power points for service, participate in 4<sup>th</sup> Thursday filming, learn and help produce worship videos, help decorate the sanctuary for Christmas, Easter, Harvest Sunday, and other special services, bake communion bread

**First** - usher, acolyte, lector (read the lessons), serve on altar guild, learn and volunteer to man the sound system (no one does that now, it would help if PJ does not have to run back and forth), learn and volunteer to man the projector (give Kristen a break every so often), play in the chime choir, sing or play an instrument for special music, volunteer to chant liturgy, put together power points for service, participate in 4<sup>th</sup> Thursday filming, learn and help produce worship videos, help decorate the sanctuary for Christmas, Easter, and other special services, bake communion bread

Of course, we have people already volunteering to do many of these things. But the reality is, in virtually every one of these activities, there are too few to share the work. And in all situations, more people are welcome.

So let me be a little more specific on my pastoral request to you. I encourage every single one of you to find at least one way to help lead worship over the next year. If you are already involved in one or more of the things listed above – thank you, please keep up the good work. But those of you who aren't, I ask you to find one thing and do it at least once. For example, if you volunteer to read, or man the projector/powerpoint, or participate in 4<sup>th</sup> Thursday Filming, and you only do so once during the year, two things will be accomplished: you will find it is a privilege to lead others in worship, and you will help assure that the liturgy is the work of *all* the people, not just *some* of the people.
