## Come have a **BLAST** on January 19th!

Mark your calendar for 4:00 p.m. on January 19<sup>th</sup> and join us at Immanuel as we BLAST off with a brand-new ministry. Then come again on Sunday evening, February 16<sup>th</sup> for our second launching.

Sunday night blast is a new joint effort between First and Immanuel that will include worship, faith formation and fellowship. It is the result of the



“rethinking Sunday School” task force. But it is not a different time nor a different way of doing Sunday School.

“I look forward to joining with my children, and with people of all ages as we worship

together, learn about our faith together, and just have a whole lot of fun.” said one member of the task force.

Being on Sunday evenings, it will offer an additional worship opportunity that might work better for the busy and varied schedules of today’s families. And since it will be an entirely different worship than on Sunday morning plus a learning activity, it will offer an opportunity for people of all ages to come and dig deeper into their faith.

“I am really excited! This is the first significant ministry we have launched together as member congregations,” Pastor Jeff commented. “We’ve shared many things like worship and supporting Another Child Foundation. But this is the first thing we’ve created together. Not only will it help us grow closer together, but it should be a great thing to invite our neighbors to.”

## Jeff's Jottings

---

It's the last day of the year. I'm sitting at my mother-in-law's house right now, staying inside away from the snow. We watched as eight or so inches came down yesterday. That will push the yearly snow total up here over 90 inches. (I wonder if I can get my mother-in-law to move to Arizona or Florida so that we can go visit her there over the New Year holiday?)

So 2019 is coming to an end and now it is time to look forward to 2020. Rather than make a list of resolutions, I want to share what I am looking forward to for the coming year. Some of these may sound like resolutions (they sort of are) while others are already well on the way to happening. Whether you want to call these resolutions or plans, here is the stuff that will keep me – and in many cases, you as well – busy in this coming year.

- **Sunday Night BLAST** – This may be the most significant thing to emerge from HOILP in its short life. The more we plan and get ready, the more I can see how this simple little gathering of people of all ages can be the foundation of our ministry. I can't overstate the multigenerational component of BLAST. One of the unspoken successes of Sunday School over the years is the sharing of faith from one generation to another. It's not just about getting children in age groups to "be schooled in faith." It's about creating an environment for faith sharing from generation to generation. Sunday School teachers don't go to college to figure out how to teach children, rather they live a life of faith and do their best to guide children how to do the same. Sunday School teachers are parents, grandparents and even young adults. In fact, of all the Sunday School and VBS teachers I had growing up – the three I remember the most are a woman the age of my grandparents, my father and a young man right out of high school or college. Well, for various reasons, the Sunday School model has come to the end of its lifespan (this is not unique to us, but happening all over the country). But there is no reason we can't create space for multigenerational faith sharing. And thus – Sunday night BLAST. In addition, because of the alternate time and the casual atmosphere, Sunday night BLAST will give us a new touchpoint to reach out to our unchurched neighbors in Compton, Lee and surrounding communities.
- **Creation Care** – Sometimes you all don't see how your pastor serves the larger church. One of the key ways I serve is as a member of the synod's Creation Care Committee. It is through that committee that I have used what influence I have to encourage congregations throughout the synod to observe what you have all come to expect each fall – Season of Creation. After a couple years of planning, it is finally coming together later this month. On Saturday January 25<sup>th</sup> there will be a morning seminar for any and all people from the synod called "Creation, Climate and the Church: Healing our 'Vitamin C' Deficiency." (see page 7) I encourage you all to attend. Since I am the organizer of that event, we will have the privilege of having the speaker, Dr. Leah Schade, as our guest preacher at HOILP the following day. Then that week, along with Dr. Schade, I'll be leading a retreat of pastors who will create a resource that all of the congregations of the synod can utilize to successfully include Season of Creation in their liturgical year. I will be the editor of this resource.
- **Hiking for Hunger** – I have a personal project that combines my love of hiking with my passion for caring for those who aren't blessed with regular meals as so many of us are. Expect to hear more about this in the near future.
- **Photographing** – It should not surprise anyone that I want to take some pictures in 2020. But one of the subjects I want to focus on this year (pun absolutely intended – Ha) is images of the two churches of HOILP – both inside and out. I was recently back at St. Matthew's in Princeton and while visiting with Pastor Schmidt there, he said that they still use my photographs of the stained glass windows and other things in the church.
- **Project Christmas Meal** – Tim Oloffson, the executive director at Another Child Foundation, has been in conversation with me about leading a trip to Romania in December to deliver the Christmas meals that we help provide. It would be a good will trip and might include serving other meals and delivering additional in-kind offerings. If you are interested in being part of this trip, let me know.

# **BLAST** is coming to a church near you!

*This article is reprinted from last month to share details about BLAST once again. Please join us on Sunday evening January 19<sup>th</sup> for the first BLAST event.*

Sunday Night Blast is coming to HOILP this January! “What is Sunday Night Blast?” you ask. Well, it is a monthly multigenerational gathering at the congregations of HOILP which will include worship, faith formation activities and fellowship. The word BLAST is an acronym of **B**elieving, **L**earning and **S**erving **T**ogether.

The concept of Sunday Night Blast came from the “rethinking Sunday School” task force. But it is important to point out that this will not be Sunday School simply moved to Sunday evenings. This is a wholly different and new type of event.

The key to it is that it is for all ages. Together young and old will learn and grow in faith. Together people of all ages will reach out and serve the world. Together, we’ll begin each BLAST event with a new and unique worship experience.

If people ask if there is Sunday School at Immanuel or First, our answer will be, “No, we don’t have Sunday School. But we have Sunday Night Blast each month which is for everyone. Come and join us.”

Each BLAST event will begin with worship complete with communion. The worship service will be about 30 minutes in length and will be designed to engage people of all ages throughout the service.

Following worship, the group will head downstairs for a learning activity and/or a service opportunity. Though families are encouraged to attend BLAST together, they may be asked to divide up for the activities as we strive to expand and grow our relationships among one another.

BLAST will take place on the third Sunday of the month beginning January 19, 2020. It’ll start at 4:00 p.m. and go for about an hour and half. January’s Sunday Night Blast will be at Immanuel while February will be at First with the intention of alternating from that point. The schedule through May can be seen on the right.

Each BLAST event will have its own leadership team of four people, usually led by Pastor Jeff. If you are able to sign up to help just one or two of the months during the year, that’d be a great help. To volunteer for any of the leadership teams or if you have any questions regarding BLAST, please talk to any of the task force members: Emily Betz, Jennifer Crumpton, Connie Schlesinger or Pastor Jeff.


