Some Notes on Sabbatical

For the first time in the History of HOILP (as well as both congregations of the parish), the pastor is being offered a sabbatical leave. So that the congregation might better understand the reasoning behind this, Greta Bates, a member from Immanuel who serves on the Parish Team and the newly formed Sabbatical team, has composed a three-part article that will be published in this and the next two Parish Voices. Pastor Jeff will include a short note of comment for each of the articles.

Rostered Minister Sabbatical by Greta Bates

From an article from the May 16, 2013 issue of Living Lutheran, *A Passport to Good Health*: "The idea of a sabbatical has biblical origins. The very root of the word is the same as that of 'Sabbath'. Throughout the Old Testament, God instructs people to work six days and rest on the seventh. In Leviticus, God instructs people to allow the land to rest every seventh year – meaning no farming, no planting, no harvesting." Along the same lines, a clergy sabbatical of 3 to 6 months is suggested by the compensation guidelines of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) and the Northern Illinois Synod (NIS) to sustain clergy health and promote renewal through a break in routine. The sabbatical is defined as a period in which the pastor has no contact with the congregation, and the congregation operates independently of the pastor for the duration of the defined period.

Personal Aspects of a Sabbatical

As suggested by the Northern Illinois Synod of the ELCA, Heart of Illinois Lutheran Parish (HOILP) has adopted in the rostered ministers' compensation package provision for a sabbatical that is designed to sustain clergy health by providing time for renewal. The clergy sabbatical affords a pastor with time for reflection without the responsibilities of regular service and provides a break in routine. Time for personal reflection adds to holistic health, and the period of no contact allows for clear and fresh perspective upon return to the congregation.

While the sabbatical is intended primarily for rest and renewal, achieving renewal of the body, mind and spirit, the pastor may also engage in activities of personal growth which may be connected to in-depth study of 1 or 2 topics directly related to the pastor's call. If the pastor chooses to do a special ministry task, it is recommended that it be done in a minimal time period and low stress.

A Note From Pastor Jeff...

Typically when I am gone from the congregation for a week, I spend the first two or three days thinking and wondering if I've got everything done before I left. And then the final two days or so, I'm usually thinking of all the tasks I need to jump into when I return home. And when I worship during my vacations, I am evaluating the service and deciding what aspects I will incorporate back at home. That is both the blessing and the curse of the job of pastor, which literally means being a member of a loving community of people.

I would expect that while I'm on sabbatical the wind down time at the beginning and the rewind time at the end may be protracted, but I look forward to an extended period of being free of ministry duties as an opportunity to refresh and renew my joy of being your pastor.

Now don't mistake my absence during my sabbatical as being away from the Church. I will be worshiping, just with our siblings in Christ all over the country. I look forward to those Sundays when I don't have to worry about unlocking the doors, checking the power point, putting last minute touches on my sermon, but just get to go to a church for worship – to come into the presence of God, having my faith fed, sharing in the sacrament, hearing the word proclaimed, receiving the forgiveness of my sins, in fellowship with other believers. In other words, I look forward to going to worship for the same reasons you do.

Now some of the churches I will be visiting will be much like HOILP. I'm working on a project that is being supported by Wartburg Seminary that seeks the best practices in shared ministry sites. So I'll be visiting parishes like ours throughout the country and asking the pastor(s) and lay people to share some of their joys in ministry with me.

As you probably know, my renewal comes from getting outside, from hiking and photography, chasing waterfalls, and birds, and mountains, and critters. I will be doing plenty of that. In fact, you may have seen a little teardrop camper in my driveway recently. Affectionately named "Little Yellow," that little camper will be my cabin on wheels this summer as I travel to places all across the country. But make no mistake, you will be with me in my heart wherever I am, because you are a part of me. And rest assured, "Little Yellow" will return to the driveway and I'll be ready and rarin' to go wherever HOILP's future takes us.

On the first Friday (March 3) and the third Tuesday of the month (March 21), volunteers are needed at 8 am to unload the pallets from the Northern Illinois Food Bank truck. These weekday events are usually completed in under 2 hours.
