Jeff's Jottings

Scattered across my desk are checklists for the liturgical pieces that make up our worship videos. I've been using these to keep myself organized for over three years now.

I make them by the liturgical season. It is an incredibly rewarding feeling to mark the final box of the season and have the entire checklist completed. I've kept all these checklists - mostly as mementos for what the last three years have been like. I have stacks of them in a pile on my desk at church. I need to get those organized. (Perhaps I should create a checklist to make sure I have all of them?) I never dreamed that after three years I would still be creating these checklists.



And now the leadership of Heart of Illinois Lutheran has correctly identified video ministry as something that we ought to continue. It was indeed a wonderful way to keep all of us connected while we were in and out of lock down a few years ago. But beyond that, it has had some benefits we feel we need to continue. It provides a worship experience for those staying home due to Covid symptoms or other illness. It offers our homebound members access to our worship life. We have friends, former members, and even existing members who live far away tuning in on a regular basis. There's even some folks watching simply because they found us on the web.

One of the quandaries in continuing our video ministry, however, is that it is time intensive for your pastor (me). Between the prerecording and editing, a huge part of my week is eaten up. In addition, it has been virtually all my equipment being utilized.

So a video worship task force was created to explore the best ways to go forward with this ministry. And they have come up with a recommendation that has been endorsed by HOILP Leadership. That recommendation is to film the Sunday morning worship service and use that for our weekly worship video. If we are able to do it effectively, that may include a live stream of the service as well.

To bring this about and do it well, there are two key resources we need to have in place. First, we need people. Obviously, I can't film while I'm leading worship. Second, we need appropriate equipment that will be able to maintain the quality of production to which we have become accustomed. Let me talk about these things in reverse order.

The task force is recommending that a two camera PTZ system be purchased and utilized. That went over many of your heads, I know. In short, it is two small high-quality cameras that can zoom in and out, turn 270°, can tilt up and down, and are controlled from a computer. The cameras would be mounted in spots where they would practically be unnoticeable. The resulting video would require only a fraction of the editing that I now have to do (I estimate only 5-10% of what I do).

There are many congregations and other organizations that use this type of system and I know it will work great for us *if...* and only *if...* we have the people to run it. The task force has recommended that a video team of 3-5 people be established that will operate the system on Sunday mornings. Olin Simpson, member at First and part of the task force, will head up the team. But we need 3-4 additional people to join him. The members would set up a schedule for who would run the system each week. You don't have to know much about videos, video editing, or computers to be part of this, you just have to be willing to learn. Members of the team would be committing to learning the system and being part of the schedule for at least a year or two as we recruit and train other interested and willing volunteers. If you would like to be part of this team, please let me know.

Initially, the video equipment and recording will be exclusively at Immanuel. The 8:30 a.m. worship time allows the opportunity to get the video out more timely. We can expand to include equipment and filming at First in the future as we see the need.

The hope was we might have this up and running prior to my sabbatical. But the timing and some of the logistical aspects have not allowed that to happen. In order to be off and running when I return, I'll work with the property committee to see what logistical pieces can be put in place and hope to hear from some of you so we can have a video team in place raring to go come August.

And finally – the worship videos for this summer will be encore productions using liturgical pieces and services from our now 3+ year old library of worship videos. (That checklist is on the right above.)

Immanuel Council Highlights April 20, 2023

- The ending balance in the General Treasury on March 31 was \$7,663.51.
- Pastor Jeff Schlesinger provided an overview of the project he will be working on during his sabbatical. He will be spending time at several long established shared ministry (multi-point) parishes across the US to create a video and develop an inventory of best practices.
- The council agreed to adopt a continuing resolution on communion practices that Pastor Jeff presented.
- As of April 18, \$60,366.12 has been received for the Raise the Roof campaign.
- Gray was the winner in the vote for the color of the new shingles. The project is estimated to start late summer or early fall, unless they have an opening sooner.
