Jeff's Jottings

Last week, I was at the annual Professional Leaders Conference that the synod puts on for pastors, worship leaders and other professionals in the church. It is a time for refreshment and renewal. Each year, there is a key note speaker who provides an educational component; a music leader who both highlights music from our tradition and introduces us to new songs; and there are fellowship opportunities over meals and afternoon activities. It is an event that most of the leaders of the synod look forward to each year.



Our keynote speaker this year was a seminary classmate of mine. It makes me feel a bit “seasoned” to realize that my immediate peers are now the ones offering expert advice to pastors. It doesn’t surprise me, however, that the Rev. Dr. Shauna Hannan has become a sought-after speaker. Even in seminary, we recognized her gifts as a deep thinker, a great communicator and a dynamic preacher. Now a professor of homiletics (that’s a fancy way of saying a preaching professor), the ELCA is fortunate to have her mentoring and guiding our future pastors.

A fellow pastor, who holds a Doctorate of Ministry in preaching himself, commented to me that she did not really share anything new with us. While he may be correct, the way she presented it and put it together renewed and inspired many of us (myself included) to rethink and reform our preaching. “We can never talk about and work on our preaching enough,” I told my colleague, to which he wholeheartedly agreed.

One of my greatest take-aways from Dr. Hannan’s presentations was a reminder of how I have always understood preaching – that a sermon is conversational, not a lecture. In other words, a sermon is not a scholastic activity in which the Bible text is deciphered and explained. That is a lecture. Rather, a sermon is designed to help people encounter God through the words of these ancient texts that we call scripture. There may be some deciphering and explaining that has to take place in order to foster experiencing God through the text, but understanding is not the goal. Hearing the good news, growing in faith, being moved to further discussion and action – those are the goals of preaching.

Dr. Hannan argued convincingly, that the work of preaching is actually a ministry of the whole congregation, not just the pastor. She didn’t mean that every person should be prepared to take a turn in the pulpit, but emphasized that the sermon “process” should include our lay people, both before and after the actual preaching of the sermon. She introduced us to a number of exercises that we can use to do just that. I’m inclined to use many of those suggestions.

Now I know that when you do continuing education, you must begin utilizing the new ideas you learned within the first two weeks or they often go by the wayside for good. I actually started using one of her suggestions the very next Sunday. You may or may not have noticed that for the last two weeks, there has not been a sermon title on the screen. That’s because Dr. Hannan suggested that we don’t do sermon titles anymore. Why? In order to engage people in the sermon activity, a good exercise is to ask other people to give a title to your sermon. By doing so, people wrestle and struggle with the Biblical text and words of the preacher, and the preacher can receive a great deal of feedback about what people are hearing. So, from this point forward, I will not name my sermons. Instead, I invite you to do so. Beginning in October, there will be slips of paper in the pews. One side of the paper will invite you to offer a name for the sermon. Simply fill it out and place it in the offering plate, or if you wish, hand it to me on your way out.

Another suggestion Dr. Hannan made is to have adults respond to the sermon in the same way that you expect of your confirmation students. I have invited all of you to feel free to fill out a worship report, but no one has taken me up on it. I do want the conversation of the sermon to carry on after I say “Amen” at the end of the sermon. So, on the opposite side of this paper will be another question which invites you to be part of the conversation.

I have other ideas about how to initiate Dr. Hanna’s suggestions that I hope to begin as the calendar turns over. But for now, please join me in the faith conversation we call a sermon. Let’s make preaching the same as all of the other ministries of our parish – a ministry of the whole congregation.

The Illinois Valley PADS (Peru & Ottawa) is open for nine months, beginning September 1st. During the past nine months, ending May 31st, PADS served 338 individuals, including 70 children. This included **35,490 meals**, along with countless hours of case management. Clients work directly with a case manager to identify individual needs and develop a specific plan toward self-sufficiency. PADS staff teaches a variety of classes, including job seeking, basic computers, money management and life and parenting skills.

The most needed items right now are paper plates, cups, bowls, paper towels, toilet tissue, dryer sheets, laundry soap and pump hand soap. Food items needed now are individual lunch items, like chicken and tuna packets and individual snack packets.

There is always a need for volunteers in Peru for evening and overnight shifts, weekdays and weekends, in two to four-hour shifts. If you are interested, go online at www.ivpads.com.
