Jeff's Jottings: Exciting Worship on the Horizon

As I write this, I'm preparing for vacation. Normally that means I have arranged for supply preachers. But not this year. I've been working hard on getting worship videos done ahead of time. So even though I will be gone, you will still see me. As they say before Steven Colbert comes out on stage for the Late Show each night, I will be, "Live on tape..."

That said, as I've been preparing, I'm pretty excited about the upcoming worship services. Not just the ones while I am going to be gone, but those that follow it as well.

It will all begin next week (Sept 6) with our "Best Of" service. Quick, think of some of your favorite portions of the worship videos over these last five plus months. Perhaps you'll see them next week as I've pieced together some of the best moments of worship.

The next Sunday we will begin an expanded "Season of Creation," which will be six weeks this year rather than four weeks. You can see what's coming up in worship on page 2.

In-Person Worship Suspended

On August 13th the Heart of Illinois Lutheran Parish councils made the decision to suspend in-person worship through Labor Day. Though we have carefully followed our protocol, which does outline the safest practices, it is the external factors that motivated the decision to move on the side of caution.

There were three key data points that brought the decision about:

- The spike in cases in Mendota has caused the city to ask businesses to cut back to phase 3 practices (as outlined in the Restore Illinois Plan)
- Mendota schools choosing to open only on-line until after Labor Day when they will reevaluate (if schools aren't comfortable meeting in person, why should we?)
- In addition, there have been seven confirmed cases in the Paw Paw zip code when previously there weren't any.

So, to assure the safety of our members, and to make sure HOILP is not party to carrying the virus toward Lee and Shabbona, the councils have decided to be extra cautious and took the undesired but necessary action of suspending our in-person worship again.

"Don't get me wrong," said one council member, "I really want to come back to worship in the church. But this disease is deadly. I don't want anybody to die. We can worship at home with in order to be safe."

Pastor Jeff and the many volunteers will continue to produce the worship videos. We will continue to work our ministries such as Bountiful Garden, NICE support and volunteering, WELCA school supply collection (which is just about complete) and so on. "We need to remember that church is not closed," said Pastor Jeff. "For safety purposes we have suspended in-person worship, but the business of following Jesus still goes forth. We will still proclaim the gospel, feed the hungry, comfort the grieving, and fight for justice."

The councils are planning to meet jointly the week after Labor Day and will evaluate the situation then. This is specific response to the context in northern LaSalle and southern Lee Counties. When the situation changes, because we already have used it, we have practices and procedures in place to safely gather again. In the meantime, we worship over the airwaves and thank God daily for our modern technology that allows us to keep in touch with one another so easily.

September 6 – "Best Of" HOILP Worship

September 13 – Season of Creation Readings and Reflections

This service, which was developed at the retreat that Pastor Jeff led for the synod last January, was put together by PJ and his daughter Kim shortly after the pandemic began as a way to share Season of Creation with the synod. It has been adapted to give us a perfect introduction to Season of Creation this year.

September 20 – Lutherans Restoring Creation: Creation Focused Worship

Pastor Jeff was recently nominated and chosen for this national committee which exists to keep the ELCA attentive to the plight of our planet. Among his first tasks with that committee was to lead a taskforce in producing a creation focused service that will be used on September 20th throughout the country. It includes well known Lutherans such as Bishop Eaton, hymn writer Marty Haugen, theologian Barbara Rossing, and author and pastor Lenny Randle. It also has a cameo of PJ sharing the peace to the country on behalf of HOILP.

N.I.C.E. Center Update

We continue to serve our needy each Saturday morning. We are well staffed and the parking lot distribution is very efficient.

Diakonia Program

Want to learn more about your Christian faith in the Lutheran tradition? Want to be more effective as a servant of Christ to others? If your answer is "Yes!", the Northern Illinois Synod diakonia program may be for you.

Diakonia is a two-year program of theological education for adults who want to grow in their faith and discover new directions for putting your faith into practice. A series of 12 courses, each five weeks in length, covers topics such as the Daily Life of a Christian, the Old and New Testaments, Communicating the Gospel, Lutheran Confessions, and Christian Ethics. The courses do not have to be taken consecutively, so if you want to try any of them out, you're welcome to do so. Tuition and books costs are minimal, and financial aid is available for those who could not otherwise afford the program.

For 2020-2021, classes will begin online via Zoom platform. New students will have their choice of either Tuesday or Thursday evenings. If you are not familiar with Zoom we will provide help in managing it. Even when it is safe to resume in-person classes in some locations, we will continue to offer the program online.

Prospective students are invited to "test-drive" diakonia by "sitting in" on a class session or two this fall. Depending on the site, the first course will be an overview of either the Old Testament or the New Testament.

JUSTICE (Mission Action) - Charlene Zimmerman

The Illinois Valley PADS in Peru is open 24/7 as of Aug. 15. The last 6 months they have been open 24/7 because of the pandemic and resulting joblessness. From Aug. 15, 2019-July 31, 2020 they served 349 clients (84 were children). They served 34,136 meals and have provided countless hours of case management which includes teaching life skills to help them obtain self-sufficiency. Classes are held in job seeking, basic computers, money management and life & parenting classes. **Their greatest needs are:**

Paper towels, paper plates, drink mixes, individually packaged snacks, bathroom cleaning supplies, coffee, gift cards for fast food and gas. Please put these items in the totes in the room next to the office.

Thank you to those that sewed the school bags and donated items. We have 150 school bags stuffed and ready to ship. And there are approx. 65 health kits ready also. **Thank You** to everyone for your donations to these projects.
