## Season of Creation Begins this Month

HOILP's annual celebration of "Season of Creation" begins on September 5<sup>th</sup> and will continue through the 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday of October. During this time we take a break from the regular lectionary (the cycle of scripture readings that dictate the themes of our service) and utilize a short set of readings that focus on God the Creator and the wonders of Creation itself.

We begin this year with a service of lessons, carols and reflections – a service that Pastor Jeff has formed that introduces all four themes of the season. The season continues with the four themed Sundays of this year. Here is the schedule:

- September 5<sup>th</sup> – Lessons, Carols, and Reflections
- September 12<sup>th</sup> – Planet Earth Sunday
- September 19<sup>th</sup> – Humanity Sunday
- September 26<sup>th</sup> – Sky Sunday
- October 3<sup>rd</sup> – Mountain and Hill Sunday

Pastor Jeff says we may add an additional Sunday on the tenth.

All are reminded that this is the time to scour through your pictures on your phone and cameras in order to share them with PJ. Part of our online videos and our in-person power points include
