Season of Creation to Begin in September

Fall has become the time when we celebrate "Season of Creation" at Heart of Illinois Lutheran Parish. This year will be no different.

Season of Creation is a period when we incorporate the goodness of God's Creation in the liturgy, lessons, and messages of our worship. It is not a time when we just talk about and learn about Creation, but a time when we join with Creation in worshiping the God who is creator of us all.

The "Season of Creation" varies for each year of our traditional cycle. This year (year A in the cycle) the worship themes along with the dates we will be doing them are as follows:

- September 10 Season Overview
- September 17 Forest Sunday
- September 24 Land & Prairie Sunday
- October 1 Wilderness Sunday
- October 8 River & Stream Sunday

Final plans for this year's activities around Season of Creation are still being made. But on the right you can see what we are hoping to do. If you have other ideas, please let PJ know and we'll see if we can get those underway as well.

Jeff's Jottings

A week ago Sunday, I was sitting in worship at Resurrection Evangelical Lutheran Church in Gretna, Nebraska. I was sitting with the Reverends Lucy and Dan Wynard, former colleagues from the Northern Illinois Synod who had just moved to the Omaha area and would not be starting at their new call until September. It was a joy to worship together with them. And it was interesting, as no one there knew that the three of us were pastors.

After worship while eating lunch, Dan asked me if my sabbatical was a success. I wasn't exactly sure if I could qualify whether it was a success or a failure, but I did share with him what worship was like that morning. "You know," I told him, "in worship this morning when we were doing the liturgy, I was able to just do it along with the rest of the congregation and not default to my leader voice. I don't think I've been able to do that in over 25 years."

So in the sense that my sabbatical, which literally means "time of rest," was intended to give me a rest from my labors as a pastor, yes my sabbatical was a success. It has been the case since about 1996 that when I'm worshipping within the congregation, I find myself defaulting to my leader's voice and have to restrain myself. Over the last month or so of my sabbatical, that default did not arise. I was able to "simply be" part of the worshipping assembly.

I am glad to be back. It felt wonderful to lead worship again this week – to preach again. And I am ever so grateful for being gifted with the sabbatical. I do believe it will offer benefits to both to Heart of Illinois Lutheran and me as a pastor, many of which we may not even recognize.

Have you ever felt really crappy, either physically or emotionally, and then got a good night's sleep and suddenly everything is 100% better? God has built into Creation our need for rest. In fact, our Creation story itself models rest when, on the seventh day, God completes everything and then takes a rest. The Hebrew word for that rest is Sabbath, the word we often use to refer to Sundays and the word from which sabbatical is derived. And of course, God builds rest right into the law with the third commandment: remember the sabbath day and keep it holy.

Note that God refers to that seventh day as the sabbath day – that is the day of rest. Have you ever thought of our Sunday mornings as our time of rest? (No, I'm not talking here about napping through the sermon.) When we come to worship, it is part of our rest from our labors, rest from the chaos of our lives. Worship is a time to rest – to take a deep breath and come before our God to hear the good news that we are beloved children of God, that we are forgiven of our brokenness, that we are valuable in God's eyes. Worship is a time to refresh – to hear the good news of Jesus, to nurture our faith – so that we can go out and live as God's people the rest of the week. Worship, my dear friends, is as vital to our faith as a good night's sleep is to our physical health.

I fill rested and ready to go as we discover where God will lead Heart of Illinois Lutheran in the future. I hope that as I lead you forth in worship, you find worship to be a mini sabbatical in your week – a time to take a deep breath, rest in the presence of your loving God, and be renewed for another week of being a disciple in your daily life.

See you in worship for a sabbatical on Sunday.



Fourth Thursday Filming

As we go forth, we plan on making changes to our video service format. But as we were unable to instigate them prior to my sabbatical, and a variety of other circumstances will delay them for a while, we will continue to provide prerecorded worship videos as we have.

In order to use my time efficiently and also incorporate others in

the video, for the remainder of 2023 I'm going to begin "Fourth Thursday Filming." On the 4th Thursday of each month I'll be video recording folks reading the lessons and prayers. I'll be specifically inviting the assigned readers for the month, but if you don't usually read at in-person but are willing to volunteer to read on video worship, please let me know so you can be included.

Things to look for (in the near future) from my sabbatical:

- A short video sharing my travels and activities
- The video that is part of my project focusing on multipoint parishes
- Photos, photos, photos many which will be part of Season of Creation.

- General Treasury ending balance July 31, 2023 was \$2,779.98.
- It is anticipated that up to \$6,000.00 will need to be borrowed from the Capital Improvement Fund to cover operational expenses in August.
- The council voted to donate \$1,000.00 from the Council Discretionary Fund to Mendota Area Christian Food Pantry's fundraiser for their new building.
- Pastor Jeff provided an overview of his travels during his sabbatical. He plans to complete his sabbatical project video within the next month.
